Priorities for future:

- Increase consultant support
- Encourage involvement of junior members (trainees, foundation doctors, medical students)
- Growth of the WRSC and further recognition nationally

3) AUGMENT (Acute management of ankle fractures) – update presented by Matt Lee

- Data on >1000 patients collected
- Interesting finding if orthopaedic surgeon performs initial ankle fracture reduction then there is a reduced chance of requiring further surgical intervention
- Presented at CST trainees day on 17/6/19
- Further analysis still to go

4) MASH (Management of acutely symptomatic hernia) – update presented by Vicky Proctor

- Protocol has been distributed and feedback received
- Still in draft format further comments welcomed
- Aiming for 80 centres, ideally signed up by October
- £2000 funding grant mostly go towards administration
- Aiming to submit for ethics later this month
- Aiming to set up towards December/January

Actions:

- Promoting at ACP next week and hopefully ASGBI/BHS
- Josh will include an advert in the trainee bulletin (Adele/Vicky to send 200 word summary about project to Josh)
- Steering group meeting Tuesday 16th July

5) MACHO (Management of acute cholecystitis) - update

• Leeds, Manchester, Hull, Doncaster, Sheffield signed up. Sheffield has started entering data on RedCap.

Actions:

- Protocol needs to be resubmitted at Leeds as initially rejected by Caldicott Guardian
- Adele to send out updated protocol with codes

6) INDIcaTES – presented by Tim O'Connor

- Academic foundation trainee research project looking into nutrition in emergency surgical patients.
- Pilot study aiming to recruit 100 patients
- Observational prospective cohort study of patients admitted as emergencies to surgical assessment unit who then go on to have laparotomy within 7 days
- Assesses acute malnutrition in peri-operative period and impact on outcomes
- Sheffield and Doncaster signed up. Keen to run elsewhere in region/country. Ideally 10+ sites.

Actions:

- Would like to run this research project with support of the WRSC.
- Plan is to run in December/January.

7) SUNFLOWER

- 1300 patients between now and 2022 across 60 sites
- Leeds, Huddersfield, Hull, Sheffield set up. Ideally trainees rotating around can continue recruiting patients and collecting data.
